The kindergarten classes will soon be celebrating the 100th day in our school year. We will be celebrating it on February 21st. To add to the special day we are requesting that children bring in a collection of 100 items to school. We would like each child to create a display of their collection. Examples could be 100 tiny drawings, 100 legos that create a building, 100 noodles in groups of 10 glued on cardboard, 100 nails hammered in a board, 100 stickers on a paper.... Please encourage your child to be creative, but this is also a great opportunity to work with your child on counting, grouping and counting by 2's, 5's, and 10's, and addition skills up to 10. We would suggest that families begin working on the project a little bit every week. This makes it more enjoyable for you and your child. Waiting until the last minute to count 100 items and create a display takes a while for some kindergarten students and becomes frustrating for everyone.

We ask that these projects be brought to school on Thursday, February 20th. They will be on display during our 100th day activities, for all kindergarten students to admire.
