
## Instructions


Student book that the child can use as needed as reference. Small enough to keep in a desk.


Many of the stories come with a visual with a reminder of the steps/behavior in story

when my teacher is at school.





When my teacher is not in the classroom I will have a substitute teacher.






My substitute's job is to teach me.
